# INTRODUCTION

The Reimbursable Advisory Services regarding the "*Capacity Building to Accelerate the Transition from Institutional to Community-Based Care for Children Deprived of Parental Care*" are provided by the World Bank within the project implemented by ANPDCA: "*PROGRESS in ensuring the Transition from Institutional to Community-Based Care*", co-financed from the European Social Fund under the Operational Program for Administrative Capacity 2014-2020.

These advisory services are complementary to those provided by the World Bank between May 2016 and December 2018 through the agreement: "*Development of Plans for the Deinstitutionalization of Children Deprived of Parental Care and Their Transfer to Community-Based Care*", provided within the project "*Development of the Plan for the Deinstitutionalization of Children in Residential Care and Their Transition to Community-Based Care*" - SIPOCA 2, co-financed from the European Social Fund under the Operational Program for Administrative Capacity and implemented by the ANPDCA.<sup>2</sup>

## OBJECTIVES of the technical assistance agreement

This technical assistance agreement has two specific objectives: (1) to support the development of evidence-based policies in the field of child protection, and (2) to develop the capacity of local public administration units to prevent the separation of children from their biological families and increase the coverage, expand the availability and improve the quality and efficiency of child related services that they provide.

## ACTIVITIES of the technical assistance agreement

In order to generate change in the child protection system, systematic data on the situation of placement centers, alternative services and prevention services at the level of local communities must be constantly generated and transparently presented.

Thus, **to achieve the first main objective - to support the development of evidence-based policies**, the World Bank team, together with the National Authority for the Protection of Children's Rights and Adoption, developed the I-Progres data management tool for the continuous monitoring of the progress of the transition from institutional to community-based care. I-Progres facilitates the systematic collection of data on the quality of alternative services from all counties of the country and automatically generates statistical reports both at the national and county level. Also, this new data management tool allows the identification of the placement centers and implicitly the counties/sectors of the Municipality of Bucharest where the deinstitutionalization process is stopped/slowed down or is not carried out adequately.

The tool for continuous monitoring of the progress of the transition from institutional to community-based care was designed to cover all four strategic directions of action for the deinstitutionalization of children deprived of parental care,<sup>3</sup> namely:

- (i) closure of the placement centers because every child must grow up in a family;

- (ii) development of alternative services to placement center care, especially family-type ones, both numerically and in terms of quality;
- (iii) strengthening case management to ensure the quality and adequacy of the protection services; and
- (iv) development of community-based prevention and support services to reduce the number of entries in the system and stimulate family reintegration.

The data management tool is structured around two components,<sup>4</sup> the first dedicated to data collection and the second to data analysis and data visualization. Both components are integrated into a data management tool called I-Progres.<sup>5</sup> The data from I-Progres was used to prepare three outputs of the project, namely Outputs 4, 5 and 8.<sup>6</sup> The analysis of community resources regarding the existing social, educational and medical services, which were included in Output 6 (chap. 2.3), Output 7 (chap. 2) and Output 9 (chap. 1.2), are also based on the data from I-Progres.

**In order to achieve the second main objective** - developing the capacity of local public administration authorities in the field of preventing child separation from the family, the World Bank developed Outputs 3, 6, 7 and 9, which are focused on the development of community services for prevention and support for children and families.<sup>7</sup>

## OBJECTIVE of Output 10

Output 10 represents a milestone undertaken under the PNRR that corresponds to Component 13 - Social reforms, Investment no. 1 for creating a network of day care centers for children at risk of being separated from their families. By substantiating investments in day care centers, Output 10 contributes to the achievement of the second main objective of the project, which aims to improve the activity of preventing the separation of the child from the family at the level of communities, especially vulnerable communities.

## SUBJECT of Output 10

Output 10 also provides a mapping of available services and infrastructure for children at risk of family separation, especially in vulnerable communities. The purpose of this mapping is to identify the communities with the greatest need to develop services to prevent child separation from the family which, at the same time, have the fewest services and infrastructure for prevention activities. In other words, the mapping identifies priority communities for investment in day care centers that meet the needs of vulnerable communities related to the prevention of child separation from the family.

Therefore, Output 10 is closely related and uses data from previous Outputs as follows:

- Output 7 presents a statistical analysis of the situation of services and infrastructure available for the prevention of child separation from the family in Romania. This analysis was carried out

on the basis of data from the ATUs level, which were collected through I-Progres, within the SPREV Register regarding services at the local level.<sup>8</sup>

- Output 6 presents the methodology for identifying the communities most exposed to the risk of child separation from the family.
- Output 9 includes a needs analysis using the data collected through the Risk Identification Fiche (FIR),<sup>9</sup> during the community censuses of families with children in rural communities selected for Output 6,<sup>10</sup> and a statistical analysis of social services at the local level carried out using the SPREV Register,<sup>11</sup> which complements the diagnosis in Output 7.

The present report, however, brings additional analysis. The mapping of services and infrastructure available for children at risk of separation from their families is carried out with updated data, namely the SPREV Register on January 1, 2022, the second round of monitoring, from all counties of the country. Also, vulnerable communities and the analysis of the needs of children and families with children in these communities is carried out using the latest available data.<sup>12</sup> This information was the foundation on which the communities recommended as investment priorities for building a network of day care centers were established.

## Preventing child's separation from the family

The conceptual approach on the transition from institutional care to community-based care is common in Outputs 3, 6, 7, 9 and 10.<sup>13</sup> Ensuring the right to life and development of the child involves that he/she enjoys family life in a safe environment, to avoid institutionalization at all costs.<sup>14</sup> The United Nations Convention<sup>15</sup> on the Rights of the Child establishes that children's separation from parents must not be applied against the will of the latter and must not lead to blocking the personal relationships and direct contacts with the two parents unless it is in line with the principle of the best interests of the child (Art. 9). Also, separation initiated by parents or members of the extended family must be prevented by measures of "providing all households with access to basic food, medicine, and services such as education" (point 156). Supporting communities, from a regulatory and financial point of view, allows them to fulfill their fundamental role, through alternative services offered to families and keeping the child in the community, to ensure the "continuity of his/her socialization and development" (point 157).

Day care centers, rehabilitation centers, counseling and support centers for children and parents along with other day care services or family-type services (foster care or placement families) can substitute the temporary or permanent inability of families to raise and care for the children and are solutions adapted to the fundamental need of children to grow up in a family. These types of services fall under the general umbrella of prevention and support services, for which the UN Convention obliges State parties to ensure special assistance and a form of alternative protection to the family.<sup>16</sup>

In Romania, there are still practices of some local authorities, mainly from less developed communities, without child and family services, in which they easily separate the child from his/her family on the grounds of the family being poor, the community powerless, and the child faring better in a residential care center of the GDSACP, believing that such modernized centers would provide the child with all the facilities that the family cannot offer. As long as these practices and beliefs are spread (at the level of authorities and population), community-based services for the prevention of the separation of children from their families and community support services have little chance to receive attention and be developed.

In contrast, at the level of legislation, Romania is aligned with international approaches. Prevention of separation by identifying and combating the risks of premature separation of children from their biological family is provided for in the legislation. According to GD no. 691/2015, in order to substantiate the activities to prevent the separation of the child from the family at the level of the territorial-administrative unit, the SPAS should identify children in risk situations that require the provision of services and benefits.<sup>17</sup> SPAS must identify risk situations in which children may be in, regarding at least:

- the economic situation of the family;
- the social situation of the family;
- the health status of the family members;
- the level of education of family members;
- housing conditions of the family (including environmental factors);
- the existence of at-risk behaviors identified within the family.

The risk of separation that must be prevented refers to situations in which families are simultaneously exposed to a multitude of factors that can contribute to the separation of the child from the family.<sup>18</sup> There is no risk of separation (therefore, separation should not be prevented) in families with stable incomes and prospects for improving and saving financial resources, where children live in decent living conditions, receive sufficient and healthy food, are healthy, benefit from quality school education and other opportunities for personal development and are protected against abuse, neglect, exploitation and other situations of violence.

In Romania, at least at the regulatory level, the activities/programs to prevent separation and support the families should cover the entire complex of factors that may cause child-family separation. Prevention includes all the activities/actions that should be undertaken before the separation happens, meaning that they should be implemented when the child lives in the family and community. Consequently, the primary prevention responsibility lies with the community institutions. SPAS is responsible for identifying, assessing, developing a prevention plan<sup>19</sup> and monitoring its implementation for each child/family with children at risk. However, the SPAS cannot effectively implement the prevention plan on its own. Most often, other local entities (from existing social services provided at school, doctors, consultative community structures, priest to NGOs, or informal support groups) must actively participate in the effective implementation of the plan and prevent the child's separation from the family.

## The national context

This document concerns the transition from institutional-based care to community-based care as a process that plans restructuring or closing down the placement centers (institutions) for children while creating, developing, and strengthening modern and effective community-based care services for children and families to prevent the separation of the child from their family.<sup>20</sup> Thus, closing down the institutions for children must be mandatorily accompanied by developing and strengthening community-based services able to prevent the separation of children from their families, to ensure a decrease in the number of children who enter public care. To this end, the communities must develop educational, health, recovery, housing and social services that should comply with development rights for all children. Day care centers represent some of the most effective services in preventing the separation of the child from the family.

During the past 15 years, Romania has made significant progress in decreasing the number of children placed in institutions by developing some family-based alternative services. The total number of children and young people separated from their families, who are in the child protection system, has dropped steadily from 2010 to 2022. However, as of January 1, 2022, about 44,334 children and young people were still in public care.<sup>21</sup>

Data from I-Progres show that in recent years (2019-2021), over 4,000 children enter the system annually.<sup>22</sup> Most of these children come from families (over 89 percent, in 2021),<sup>23</sup> and are girls and boys, to an equal extent, most of them without disabilities (91 percent, in 2021) up to 10 years old of age (65 percent, in 2021).<sup>24</sup> The most frequent causes of separation are related to neglect, abuse or child exploitation (55 percent of total entries) or social causes (26 percent), among which the following are predominant: poverty and poor housing, disorganized families or underage mothers/parents, along with the excessive consumption of alcohol or other substances and promiscuous or criminal behavior by adults in the family. Therefore, in Romania, it is essential to reduce the number of entries in the child protection system, and for this purpose, the prevention services providing support to consolidate the family must play a key role.

## STRUCTURE of Output 10

The report is organized into three chapters. The first chapter includes the mapping of services and infrastructure available for children at risk of separation from their families, based on the analysis from the SPREV Register.<sup>25</sup> The second chapter analyzes vulnerable/marginalized communities that concentrate children at risk of separation, based on a national typology. The third chapter presents the conclusions regarding the communities (vulnerable/marginalized) with the greatest needs and the fewest resources (services and infrastructures) identified to be the investment priorities for building the network of day care centers with the potential for maximum impact in preventing separation.

# Mapping of services and infrastructure

# 1. Services and infrastructure available for children exposed to the risk of separation from their family

This focuses on mapping services available locally in Romania. For this purpose, we use SPREV Register containing data collected at the level of administrative-territorial units (ATUs), as of January 1, 2022.<sup>26</sup> The completion rate for SPREV Register is 100 percent nationally (i.e., 3,186 ATUs).<sup>27</sup>

Prevention services<sup>28</sup> include a wide range of formal structures, formal or informal services and interventions. While most known prevention services are part of reference framework of social services, the needs of the target group, children at risk of separation and their families, are diverse and require integrated interventions and additional support from complementary areas: education, health, employment, housing. For this reason, SPREV Register collects data on the entire list of services that SPAS should consider when planning interventions and new services according to legal provisions.<sup>29</sup> These include: (1) services to prevent the child's separation from the family, such as day care centers, counseling and support centers for parents, etc.; (2) educational services; (3) medical services; (4) information services on legal matters; (5) services for children with disabilities; and (6) other services such as social canteens, shelters for victims of domestic violence, premarital counseling for young couples, counseling offices for citizens, etc. In addition, SPREV Register includes information about NGOs or other civil society stakeholders (informal groups, charitable groups, parents' associations, etc.) active in preventing child-family separation or child protection within the community.

Furthermore, SPREV Register also includes only data regarding specialists that exist at local level. These data are highly relevant as many communes do not always need a center type service<sup>30</sup> to ensure access of vulnerable groups to services. Given the relatively small number of potential beneficiaries, many rural communities, for example, do not need a day care center, but they need instead daycare services, nor do they need a counseling center, but they need counseling interventions/activities. Such interventions/activities can often be provided by a community-based specialist, a volunteer, or a mobile team coming from another locality. Moreover, in addition to the relatively small number of potential beneficiaries, insufficient local budgets make it difficult to ensure the sustainability of such centers. A realistic plan to develop services at the commune level must consider all these types of services—centers, interventions/activities, and specialists. As a result, SPREV Register includes all these types of community-based resources, both public and private.

However, out of all types of community-based resources that can help prevent child-family separation, two resources are deemed essential (as in they make the most significant contributions), namely day care centers and local specialists.

## 1.1. Day care centers for children

SPREV Register keeps a record of the day care centers for children and families with children as listed in the Classification of Social Services as reflected in the diagram below.

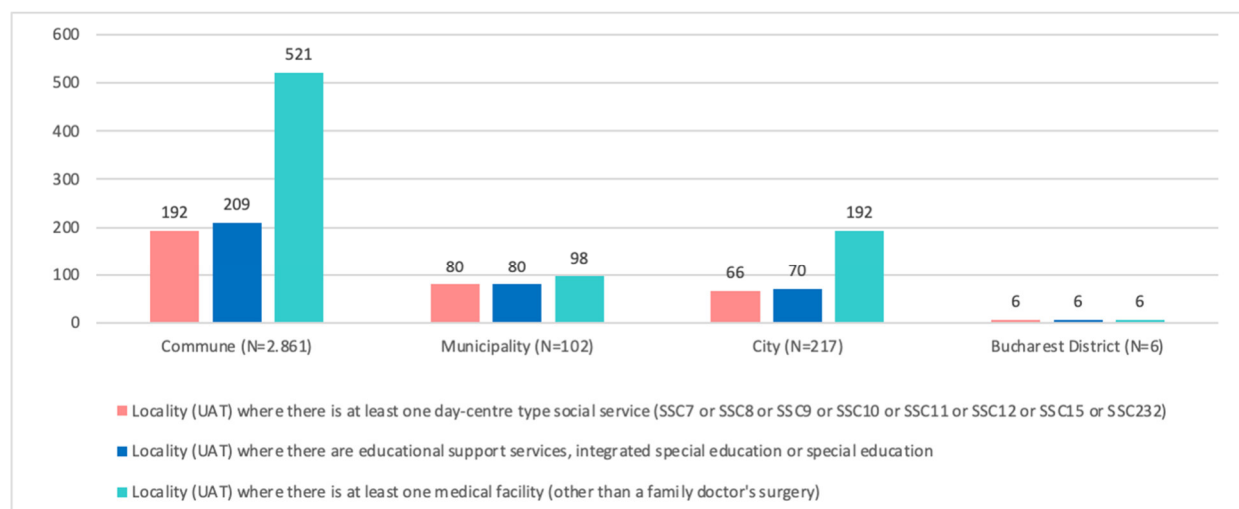

**According to SPREV Register data, as of January 1, 2022, only 11 percent of the country's ATUs had at least one day care center for children or families with children.** The proportion of localities with at least one day care center available varies significantly from 78 percent of municipalities to 30 percent of towns and only 7 percent of communes (Figure 1).

Center type educational services and schools providing educational support services, integrated special education or special education are just as few and unevenly distributed across localities. These types of services are available in 78 percent of municipalities, 32 percent of towns, and only 7 percent of communes. There are however more center type medical services (other than the family doctor practice). 26 percent of ATUs have at least one hospital, polyclinic, permanence medical center, school medical office or dentist's office. The variations across types of localities remain however marked with

regard to center type medical services too: 98 percent of municipalities, 88 percent of towns, and only 18 percent of communes.

Among the day care centers for children country-wide, day care centers for children at risk of separation from their parents (reported by 184 SPASs) account for the highest percentage, followed by recovery centers for children with disabilities (reported by 97 SPASs). At the other extreme, guidance, supervision and support centers for the social reintegration of a child who has committed criminal offenses and is not criminally liable and day care centers for homeless children account for the lowest percentage, each category being reported by a group of ten localities.

### Day care centers for children at risk of separation from their parents

SPASs have reported 184 ATUs with at least one such operating center. The reported number for this type of center is 261, of which 157 located in urban areas and 104 in rural areas. For comparison, one year ago (as of January 1, 2021), a total of 239 such centers were reported for 170 ATUs, of which 137 in urban areas and 102 in rural areas.

In early 2022, day care centers for children at risk of separation from their parents were present in 6 percent of the country's ATUs, with significant variations across types of localities: almost half of the municipalities (47 percent) reported having such centers, 18 percent of towns, and only 3 percent of communes. In Bucharest, four sectors reported having this type of center.

Most day care centers for children at risk of separation from their parents are located in Center, North-East, and South-Muntenia regions, particularly in Iași, Covasna, Harghita, and Sălaj counties. In addition, Dâmbovița County has a higher number of this type of day care center, located in 13 localities.



## Recovery centers for children with disabilities

As of January 1, 2022, 97 ATUs with a total of 149 recovery centers for children with disabilities were reported by SPASs. The number is increasing, but the increase is small compared to 91 ATUs accounting for 130 centers as of January 1, 2021.

The distribution remains highly uneven across the country because these centers are available almost only in urban areas (132 of the 149 recovery centers), only 17 communes having been reported to include one center. And of the 17 communes, only five have marginalized areas. It can be thus concluded that the overwhelming majority of children living in rural marginalized areas have no access to recovery centers, since they do not have the means to travel to them.

But even among towns, only 9 percent have a recovery center for children with disabilities (20 towns with 22 centers). As for the municipalities, only around half of them (53 percent) reported having a recovery day care center (i.e., 54 municipalities with a total 94 centers). Bucharest does best, with 16 recovery centers in its six sectors.

Most regions have eight to 16 localities with one recovery day care center for children with disabilities. Center region stands out with 26 ATUs accounting for a total of 44 operating recovery centers. In contrast, Ilfov has only three ATUs with three centers, and South-West only four ATUs with five centers<sup>31</sup>.

## Day care centers for the development of independent living skills

The first observation is that unlike the other types of centers presented above, day care centers for the development of independent living skills had their development halted in 2021. Therefore, at the end of 2021, there were fewer centers reported than at the beginning of 2021: 53 centers located in 41 ATUs, as of January 1, 2022, compared to 55 centers in 43 ATUs, as of January 1, 2021.

Among the localities with one day care center for independent living, there are 14 communes (0.5 percent of the total number of communes in the country), seven towns, 18 municipalities, and two Bucharest sectors. Moreover, of the 992 communes with marginalized areas nationally, only three receive the services of a day care center for independent living (five centers in total).

Most of these centers are located in Center region (15 localities). By contrast, SPASs in South-West region reported zero independent living centers, and those in Ilfov only reported two.

## Counseling and support centers for parents and children, including pregnant women prone to abandon their child

The development of centers for counseling and support for families and children has also stagnated in 2021. At the beginning of 2021, there were 66 such centers recorded in SPREV Register, located in 56 localities (or two percent of Romania's ATUs). At the end of 2021, SPAS reports showed almost no changes: there were 65 centers in 57 ATUs.

There are almost no day care centers for families with children in rural areas (only 20 communes accounting for 20 centers) and in towns (only six towns accounting for six centers). Even at the level of municipalities, only 28 account for a total of 35 day care centers for families with children. Moreover, those places with many families with children exposed to a multitude of risk factors associated with child-family separation—i.e., communes with marginalized areas and communes that are a source for the special protection system—these centers are almost non-existent.

While they are distributed across the country's regions, there are disproportionately few in Ilfov (one center) and in South-West region (two centers). South-East and South Muntenia regions are not faring much better, each having five-six centers located in four-six ATUs.

## Overview: All types of day care centers for children

Having presented an analysis by type of day care center above, this section considers all day care centers regardless of their type. An aggregated analysis of day care centers is possible because, in practice, many day care centers (with different providers) are licensed as various types in services when in fact they conduct similar activities, as a result of the legislation allowing for any combination of type of center, applicable quality standard, and package of activities actually carried out by the center.

As of January 1, 2022, a total of 724 day care centers were recorded in SPREV Register, from 344 localities country-wide. SPASs in 217 ATUs reported the presence of one day care center for children.

- Of all municipalities, 78 percent have at least one day care center, of which 57 percent have from two to 22 centers, accounting for a total number of 322 day care centers nationally.
- Of all towns, 70 percent do not have a day care center, 21 percent have only one, and 9 percent have from two to maximum five centers, accounting for a total number of 99 day care centers for children nationally.
- Of all communes, 93 percent do not have a day care center, 6 percent have only one, and 1 percent have from two to seven centers per commune, accounting for a total number of 254 day care centers for children nationally.
- Of the 992 communes with marginalized areas, around 8 percent (or 80) have a day care center.

The distribution of existing day care centers across regions is very uneven. On the one hand, North-East and Center regions include 77 and 78 localities, respectively, with at least one operating day care center per locality. On the other hand, the number of localities with day care center drops to five ATUs in Ilfov and 21 ATUs in South-West, respectively. In the remaining regions, 35-47 localities have a day care center for children and families with children. Correspondingly, almost 44 percent (or 316) of the 724 day care centers are located in just two regions, North-East and Center. By contrast, the number of day care centers in Ilfov and South-West together is smaller than the number of day care centers in Bucharest (44 compared to 49).

## 1.2. Locally Available Specialists in the Prevention of Child-Family Separation

The second type of community-based resource that can make a significant contribution to preventing child-family separation is locally available specialists working in the social, education and medical areas. Of all the types of community-based specialists included in SPREV Register, those in Diagram 2 are among the most widespread and are considered for analysis in this chapter.

**Diagram 2: Specialists providing community-based services for children and families**

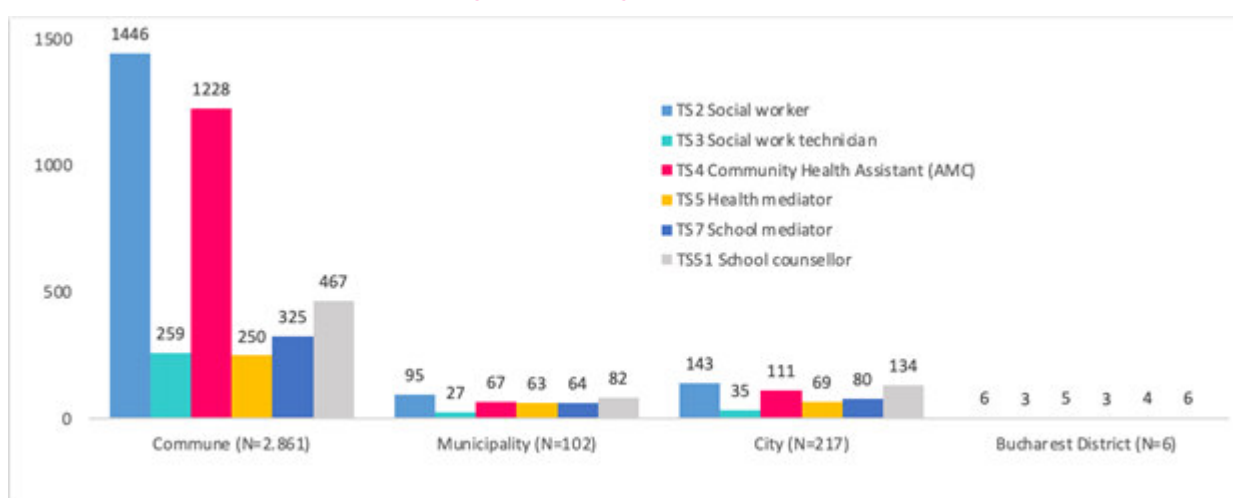

Although the law<sup>32</sup> provided as early as 2011 the requirement for each ATU to create a SPAS and that social assistance must feature in the minimum package of social services that each ATU must provide, as of January 1, 2022, only 56 percent of localities had created a SPAS. In fact, while 100 percent of municipalities and 87 percent of towns have a SPAS, only 52 percent of communes have created one. Regional variations are just as high. While in North-East, 76 percent of ATUs report having created a SPAS, the proportion drops to 45 percent for localities in South-Muntenia and, respectively, 43 percent for those in South-West.

Regardless of whether they have a SPAS or not, out of a total 3,186 ATUs, including the administrative-territorial subdivisions of Bucharest, only 873 social assistance public services obtained their license as social services providers,<sup>33</sup> under Law No. 197/2012 on quality assurance in social services, as subsequently amended and supplemented, accounting for only 27 percent of communities. The main reason is the lack of financial resources to develop community-based services.

## Social assistance specialists (SPAS staff)

**Social workers**<sup>34</sup> were reported in 53 percent of the country's ATUs. The proportion of localities with at least one SPAS social worker is 94 percent for municipalities, dropping to 66 percent for towns and 51 percent for communes (with or without marginalized areas). This means that in about one third of towns and half of the communes, social assistance is provided without social workers. Only in municipalities and larger towns, a Romanian citizen is likely to receive the services of a social worker. As a result, the citizens' access to services is uneven, which goes against the provisions of Law No. 292/2011, according to which all citizens have a right to social assistance. In total, over one million children live in the 1495 localities with zero social workers, with the majority of them living in rural areas (NIS, data as of January 1, 2021).<sup>35</sup>

The variations across counties regarding the presence of social workers are significant too. For instance, the proportion of ATUs with at least one social worker ranges from 22 percent (Teleorman) to 82 percent (Iași), compared to a national average of 53 percent.<sup>36</sup>

**Social assistance technicians** are listed in SPREV Register for 10 percent of localities, i.e., 26 percent of municipalities, 16 percent of towns, and 9 percent of communes reported having them. In addition to rural-urban discrepancies, the policies of mayoralties regarding the hiring of social assistance technicians vary significantly as follows:

- In rural areas, it is much more likely to find a social assistance technician in ATUs without a social worker (13 percent compared to 6 percent).
- Communes with marginalized areas are more likely to hire social assistance technicians compared to communes without marginalized areas (15 percent compared to 7 percent).
- ATUs in North-East and South-East regions are more likely to hire social assistance technicians than localities in other regions, especially in South-West. Moreover, 44 percent of all ATUs with at least one social assistance technician come from the two regions mentioned.
- The variations across counties are similarly high. At one extreme, Mehedinți and Harghita report zero localities with a social assistance technician, and Argeș and Arad report only 1-2 such ATUs.<sup>37</sup> At the other extreme, eight counties—Bacău, Buzău, Constanța, Dâmbovița, Mureș, Sălaj, Suceava, and Vaslui—report from 15 percent to 20 percent of all localities in the county as having at least one technician.

In any case, the quality of services offered by SPAS vary significantly across localities. The quality of services, especially prevention services, is wanting not only because the lack of social workers in some localities, but also because training specialists in child assistance and protection is currently limited.

## Health specialists

Primary care—family doctor and nurses—is available in almost all Romanian localities. In addition, 44 percent of ATUs have community health assistants (AMC), and 12 percent have health mediators (community social workers typical of areas with Roma communities). But the discrepancies between the urban and the rural are substantial in this respect, in favor of towns and cities. So the proportion of localities where AMC are available decreases from 66 percent of municipalities to 51 percent of towns, and 43 percent of communes, respectively. Similarly, the proportion of localities having a health mediator drop from 62 percent to 32 percent and 9 percent of communes, respectively.

The practices of counties when it comes to hiring an AMC also vary considerably. For example, only 5 out of a total of 58 localities in Brașov county hired an AMC. This is similar to other counties, such as Caraș Severin, Covasna or Argeș. By contrast, Botoșani county has 73 out of 78 ATUs with at least one

AMC. So do Gorj or Tulcea. Regionally the percentage of localities with AMC ranges from 70 in South-West to only 15 in West region.

The number of localities where a health mediator is available is much lower, and their distribution more uneven. At regional level, the proportion of ATUs with a health mediator is significantly higher only in Ilfov (33 percent) and Center (19 percent), while in West, we find a particularly low proportion (5 percent). At county level, there are counties, e.g., Hunedoara, Ialomița, Maramureș, Timiș or Teleorman, with under four localities where a health mediator is available. There are however counties with were much more active in recruiting health mediators for Roma communities, e.g., Mureș, Sibiu, Vaslui, Giurgiu or Harghita.

Key specialists in providing support to children with disabilities, such as speech therapists and physiotherapists, are available in 85 percent of municipalities but only in 39 percent of towns and almost 3 percent of communes. So even in the urban, the number of speech therapists and physiotherapists is insufficient.

## Education specialists

The first structural problem is the lack of adapted education for children with disabilities or CES (special education needs), as shown in Figure 1. Only 7 percent of all communes have a school providing educational support services, integrated special education or special education. This structural problem constitutes: (1) one of the reasons why many children enter the child protection system; and (2) one of the reasons why some children with disabilities or CES are left out of the education system altogether.

The second structural problem is the insufficient number of relevant specialists, such as psychologists, school mediators, school counselor, support teacher or speech therapist teacher. This problem is one of the main causes of the disproportionately high risk of dropout or early leaving the school among children with disabilities or CES enrolled in a form of education. In this regard, SPREV Register shows that, as of January 1, 2022, around 40 percent of all localities had at least one specialist offering prevention services and support services for accessing education (in addition to the teaching staff)—i.e., almost all municipalities and towns, but only 35 percent of communes (the remaining 65 percent lacking such a specialist). At the level of communes, of the types of specialists listed, according to representative of public authorities, school counselors are the most widespread, as they are available in 16 percent of communes.<sup>38</sup> School mediators were reported for 11 percent of communes,<sup>39</sup> psychologists for 12 percent,<sup>40</sup> itinerant or support teacher for 10 percent,<sup>41</sup> and speech therapist teachers for 2 percent of communes.<sup>42</sup>

## Overview: All types of specialists who offer prevention services for children

In this section we switch from the analysis by type of specialist to the aggregated analysis of specialists in all six types in Diagram 2. As shown in the previous sections, the six types of specialists in the social, education and health areas are the main providers of community-based services/interventions for children and families with children. Their availability is even more important for smaller communities, with a relatively small number of children, as well as smaller local budgets that could not finance a center type of service.

In total, as of January 1, 2022, according to SPREV Register, 81 percent of localities had at least one in the following six types of specialists: social worker, social assistance technician, AMC, health mediator, school mediator or school counselor. Out of these localities, 36 percent had only one type of specialist (out of the six), and 45 percent had two or more. The most widespread combination is social worker and AMC, both in the rural and in the urban, as shown in Figure 2.

The gap between the urban and the rural remains, but narrower. While only 1 percent of municipalities and 6 percent of towns have no specialist, regardless of the type, the percentage for communes is 20. Counties with a smaller coverage of specialists in the six types considered are Bihor, Covasna, Hunedoara, and Prahova. Regionally only West region shows a distribution different from the national one: 28 percent of ATUs have zero specialists, 45 percent have only one type of specialist, and 27 percent have one or more types (of the six considered).

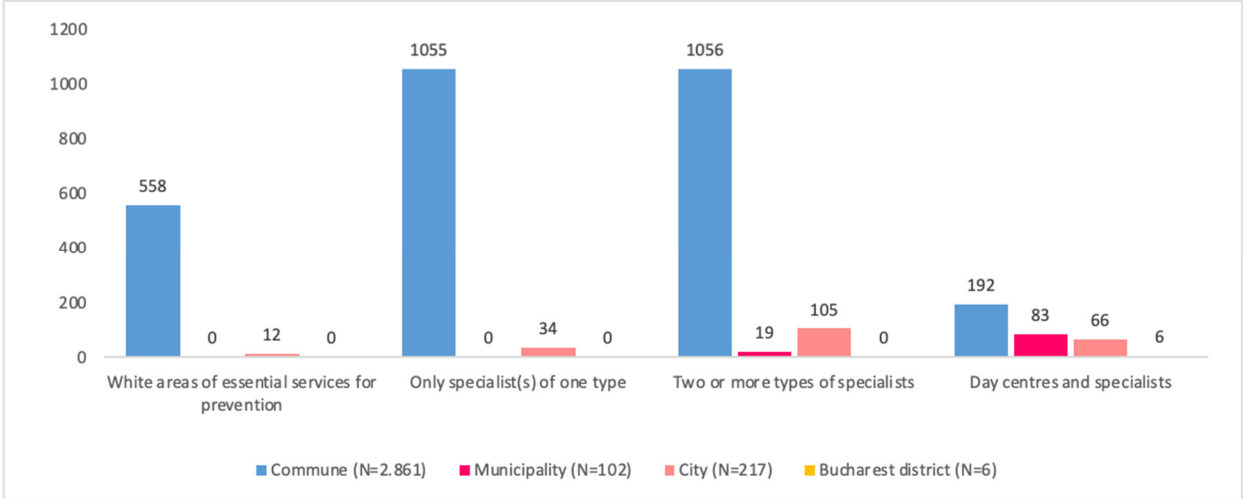
### 1.3. Map of available services and infrastructure

To build the map of available services and infrastructure, we used aggregated indicators of basic community resources analyzed in previous sections, namely:

- day care centers for children; and
- specialists in social, education, and health areas providing prevention and support services in the community.

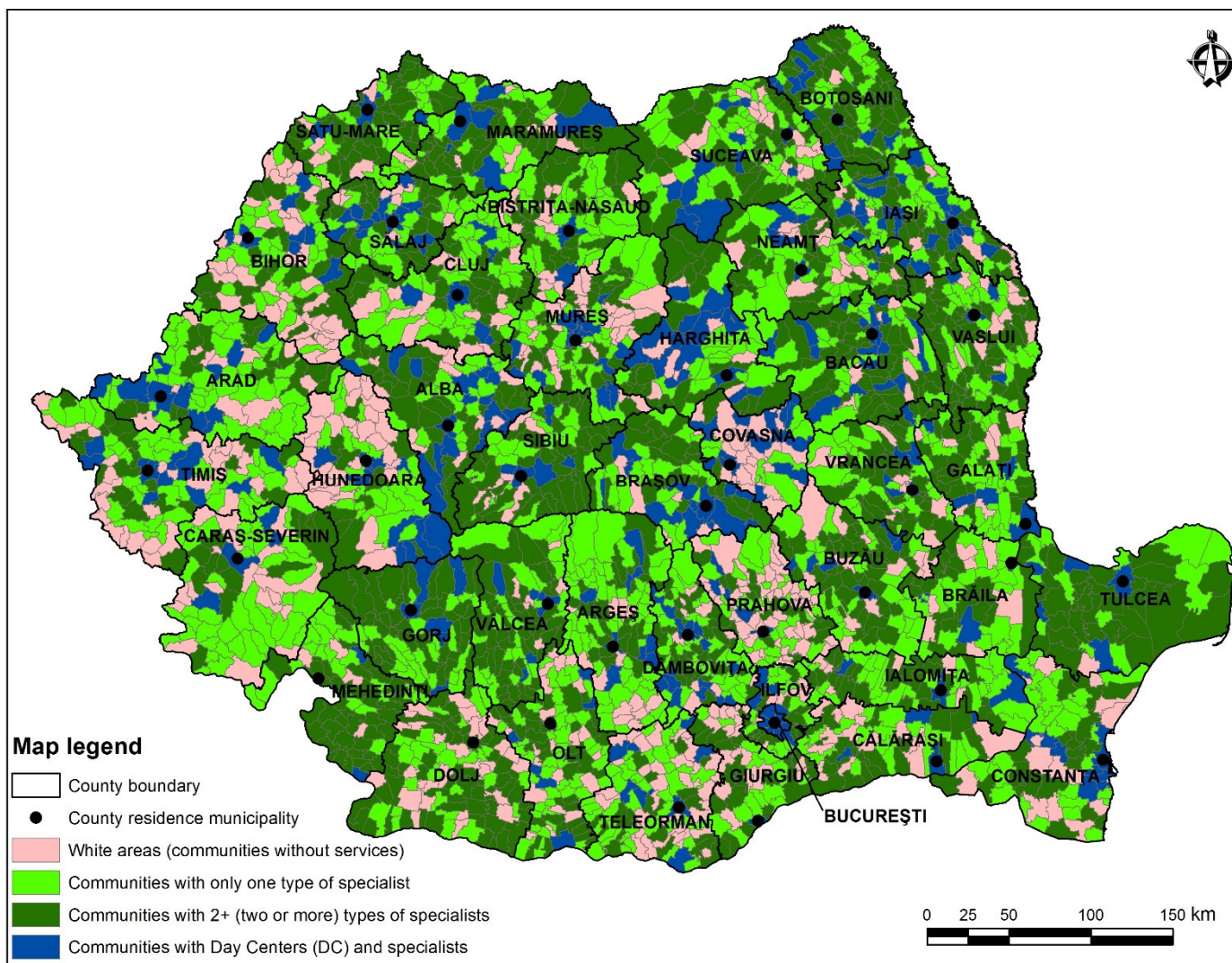
**Figure 3: Distribution of Romanian localities according to basic services to prevent the child’s separation from the family (day care centers and specialists), by type of locality (number of ATUs)**

The intersection of the two aggregated indicators yielded a classification of all localities according to the available services and infrastructure, as shown in Figure 3 and Map 1.

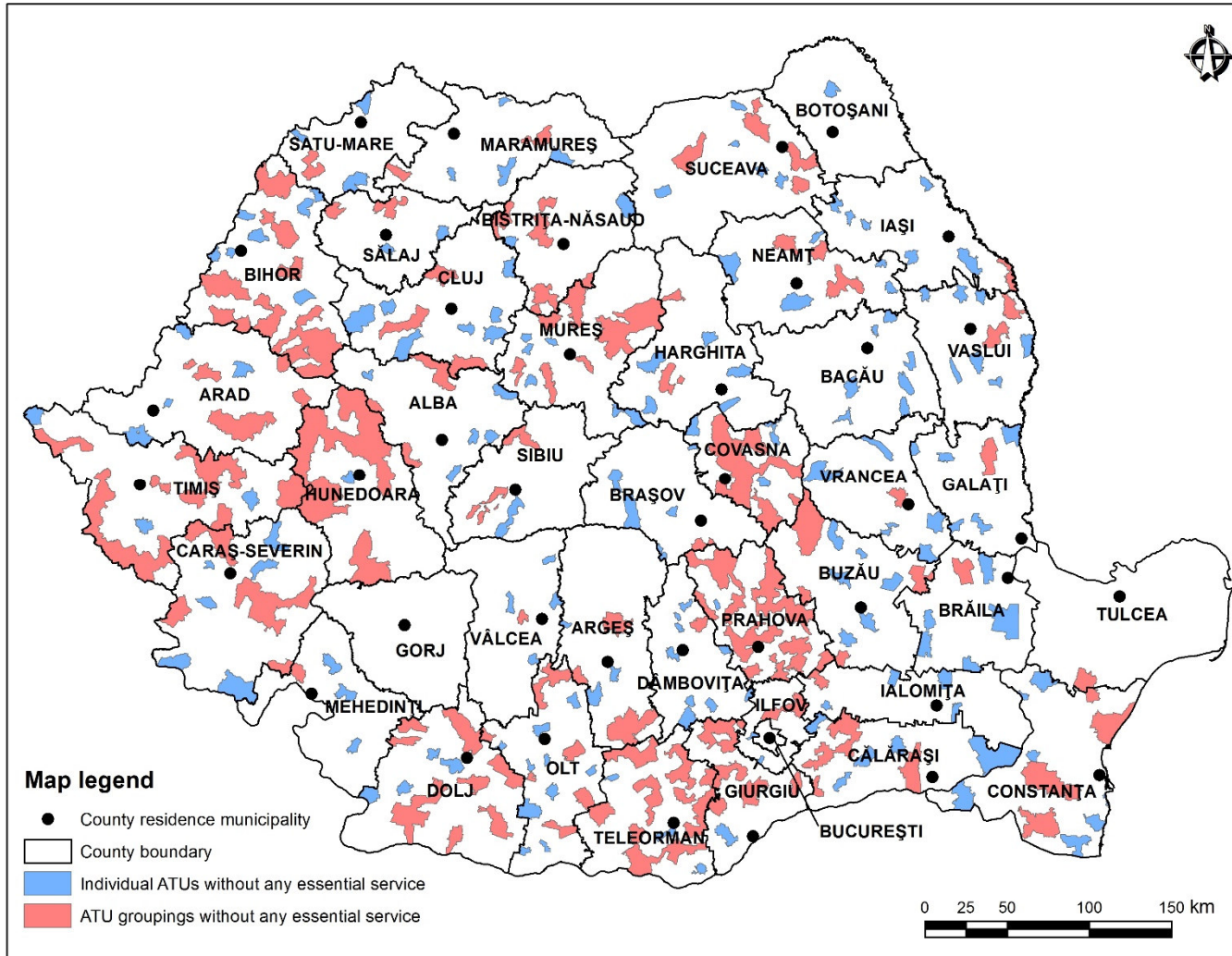


Map 1: Territorial distribution of Romanian localities according to basic services to prevent the child's separation from the family (day care centers and specialists)

The analyses of available services and infrastructure for children at risk of separation from their families shows that the need for intervention at municipality level is low. Bucharest and 81 percent of Romania's municipalities already (as of January 1, 2022) have the resources necessary for activities for the prevention of separation.<sup>43</sup> On the other hand, towns and communes have much higher needs. Figure 3 shows that:

- Of the total number of towns, only 30 percent have the basic resources (day care centers and specialists) for the prevention of child-family separation. Almost half of towns (48 percent) have specialists but no day care centers. In 16 percent of towns, only one type of specialist is available, e.g., a social worker or an AMC or a school counselor, and 6 percent of towns fall into the category of white areas for services.
- Of the total number of communes, only 7 percent have the basic resources (day care centers and specialists) for the prevention of child-family separation. Almost three quarters of communes (74 percent) have one or more specialists from one or more types, most often, a social worker and an AMC. Finally, 20 percent of Romania's communes fall into the category of white areas for services.

## 1.4. White areas for services for children at risk of separation from their families

White areas for services to prevent child-family separation require a separate analysis. Map 2 is a cut out from the general map (Map 1) that shows only the white areas for services, i.e., those communities that lack both day care centers and a specialist from any of the following types: social worker, social assistance technician, AMC, health mediator, school mediator or school counselor.

White areas for services include 570 localities, of which 12 towns and 558 communes (Figure 3). Map 2 shows that these ATUs tend to be grouped into territorially continuous formations, located mostly on the limits separating counties. This confirms once more the findings of previous studies which showed that the farther the location of a commune from the county's administrative center (especially true of communes historically moving between counties), the greater the chances that the commune is underdeveloped.

As a result, out of 570 localities in white areas, 399 ATUs are grouped into territorially continuous formations, and only 171 of them stand alone (with no neighboring locality belonging to a white area). Of the towns in white areas, 10 are grouped into territorially continuous formations, and only two stand alone. Similarly, most of the 558 communes in white areas (389 or 70 percent) are grouped together.

The 399 ATUs grouped into territorially continuous formations account for 91 such formations that include from 2 to 28 localities. Most of the formations are made up of two or three adjacent localities (46 and 10, respectively, out of the 91). There are some extensive white areas, however. The largest one includes 28 localities in Hunedoara, Timiș, and Alba counties. Another extensive white area consists of 20 localities in Prahova and Buzău counties (see Map 2). The third largest such area is made up of 19 localities, all of them located in Covasna County.

In North-East and South-East, white areas are more dispersed (a larger proportion are standing alone). By contrast, West and South-Muntenia regions are dominated by groups.<sup>44</sup>

But not all ATUs in the white areas for services are vulnerable communities. Some communes have an aging population and a correspondingly small number (and proportion) of children, hence the lack of services for children. Other communes have more children but the risk of child-family separation is relatively low in the community. Therefore, in order to set investment priorities for day care centers,

one more step is needed, namely, to identify not only white areas for services but also vulnerable communities that simultaneously lack basic resources for activities to prevent separation.

# Identification of vulnerable communities

## 2. Vulnerable/marginalized communities and the identified needs of children and families with children

The next step in establishing the investment priorities in day care centers is to identify vulnerable communities and the specific needs of children and families from these communities. Therefore, this chapter is structured in three sections. The first section briefly presents the vulnerable/marginalized communities identification methodology, developed in Output 6 of the project.<sup>45</sup> The second section comprises of an analysis of children's and families' with children needs, using the most recent data gathered through 72 vulnerable/marginalized community censuses.

### 2.1. Vulnerable/marginalized communities identification methodology

In order to identify the vulnerable communities most exposed to the risk of child separation from their family, the World Bank team developed a national typology structured as an intersection of two dimensions, namely:

- The index of community risk developed by UNICEF (version updated for July 2021);
- The existence of a rural marginalized area within the commune (according to the Atlas of Rural Marginalized Areas developed by the World Bank in 2015).

#### The index of community risk

The index of community risk (IRC)<sup>46</sup> is a composite index built upon the following seven indicators:

1. Number of children (0-17 years old) with domicile within the locality (NIS data, as of January 1, 2021);
2. Type of locality (urban/rural);
3. The proportion of children in the total population of the locality (NIS data, as of January 1, 2021);
4. Relative poverty risk (AROPE) (NIS data for 2018 at the macro-region level);
5. Share of social aid beneficiaries in total population (NIS data for 2018 at the county level);
6. Registered unemployment rate (NIS data for March 2020 at the county level);
7. School dropout rate (NIS data for 2017 at the county level);

Note: The index of community risk is calculated by multiplying the scores of the seven indicators described above, and the result is divided in three categories: Low community risk – Values lower than 0.5; Medium community risk – Values between 0.5 and 2; High community risk – Values higher than 2. The definition of each indicator can be found in Annex 1.

Based on the IRC, out of the total 2,861 Romanian rural localities, 29 percent have a low community risk, 51 percent have medium risk, and 21 percent have a high risk. A high IRC indicates a disproportionately high need for the development of social and educational services.

## The rural marginalized areas

World Bank studies<sup>47</sup> have shown that in Romania there are “source communities” (rural and urban), areas at locality or sub-locality level<sup>48</sup> from where, compared to the other localities/areas, a significantly higher number of children reach the public special child protection system. I-Progres data confirms the existence of source communities in Romania.<sup>49</sup> Therefore, in the urban area, 222 towns and cities (out of the total 320 in the country) total 37 percent of all children/young people in the system, and in the rural area, 519 communes (out of the total 2,861 in the country) concentrate 30 percent (or 8,232) of children/young people in the system. In conclusion, there is a disproportionately high probability for a child/young person in the system to come from/be reintegrated either in one of the 222 towns/cities or in one of the 519 rural source communities.

Not only are there rural source communities, but most of them are communes that have at least one marginalized area, as they are defined and identified in the World Bank atlases.<sup>50</sup> Marginalized areas are extremely disadvantaged areas, where the population has at most secondary education, earns informal income (especially from agriculture and work by the day), and lives in poor housing, even by rural standards, which generally have limited access to basic infrastructure and utilities (overcrowded houses and/or without access to water or electricity). These marginalized areas are considered “problematic” due to a combination of factors, namely the large number of low-income households, the low level of education and skills required in the labor market, the preponderance of single mothers, the large number of children and the high rate of petty crime. To a larger extent than other communities, especially in the rural environment, the marginalized areas are characterized by poor physical accessibility, with unpaved roads, inadequate housing, exposure to environmental risks (floods, landslides etc.) and poor quality or absence of public services.

At national level, the share of communes with at least one marginalized area is approximately 35 percent of total communes. But this share rises to 61 percent of the 519 source communities. Therefore, in Romania, services for the prevention of separation of the child from the family must be developed primarily in the source communities for the child protection system and in marginalized communities in which the factors contributing to separation (poverty, poor housing, unwanted parental behavior, disorganized families etc.) abound. Particularly for this reason, the second dimension of the national typology for identifying vulnerable communities refer to the existence of a marginalized area within the commune.

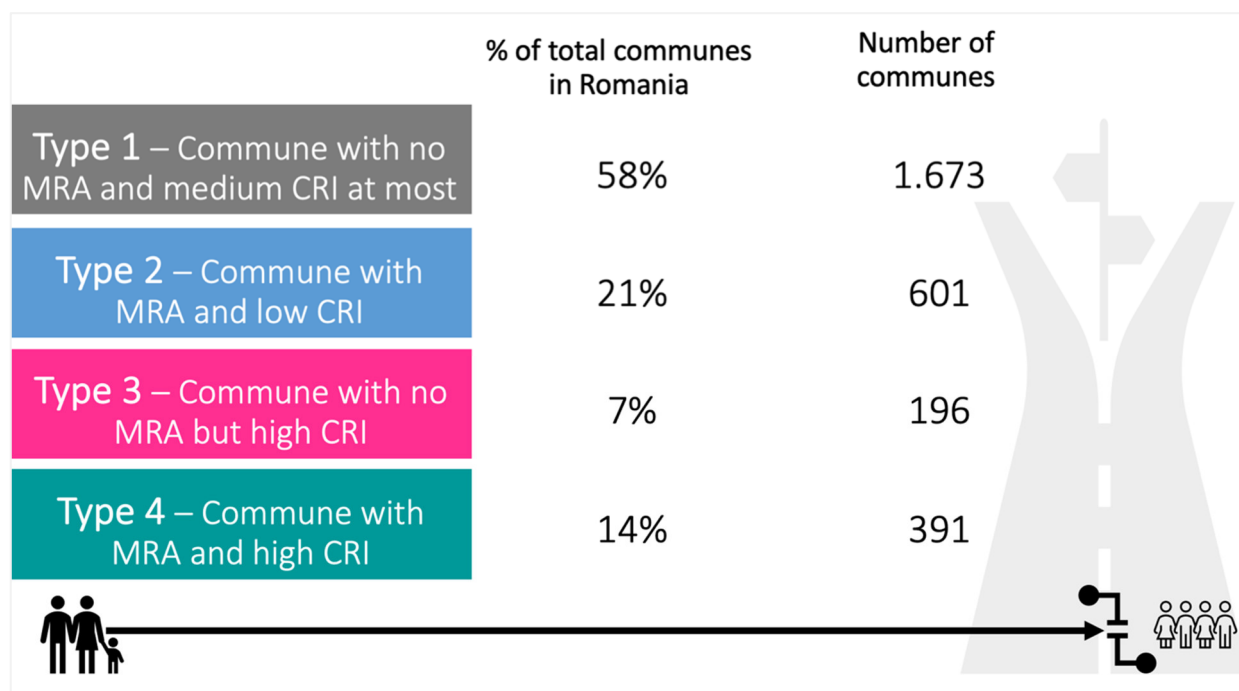

## The national typology of vulnerable communities most exposed to the risk of child separation from family

The national typology represents the intersection between the index of community risk (IRC) and the existence of at least one marginalized area (ZRM) within the commune and contains the four types listed below.

In other words, from the perspective of the risk of child separation from family, 42 percent (or 1,188) of all the communes in the country are vulnerable communities in which children can be exposed to the risk of child separation from family and, therefore, have varied needs of developing social, educational and/or health prevention services. The vulnerable communities are significantly more numerous in Dolj, Vaslui, Iași, Bacău and Buzău counties.

## 2.2. Needs analysis of children and families with children from vulnerable communities

The focus of this subchapter is the analysis of the risk situations and the needs of families with children from vulnerable rural communities from Romania. The data used in this analysis are from the community censuses of families with children from 72 communes that participated in the activities associated with Output 6,<sup>51</sup> with the objective of elaborating their own plan for the development of services of prevention of child's separation from the family. The community censuses of families with children, used in this subchapter, provide a sample that allows for a solid statistical analysis, but it is not nationally representative for the rural area.

The community censuses were conducted by the local teams (SPAS) with assistance from the World Bank, between October 2021 - January 2022.<sup>52</sup> They followed the unitary methodology aligned with the current legislative framework.<sup>53</sup> In the first phase, SPASs drafted the Observatory of children in the community, that should have included all children (0-17 years old) and families with children that live in the commune.<sup>54</sup> During the second phase, any risk suspicion,<sup>55</sup> collected from any local specialist (based on the information from the Observation Fiche),<sup>56</sup> was registered in the Observatory, for each family with children. In the third phase, SPASs applied the Risk identification fiche (FIR) to all households registered in the Observatory with at least one risk suspicion.<sup>57</sup> Through this, the children in risk situations have been identified and assessed<sup>58</sup> as well as their specific needs for services and social benefits to substantiate activities/services to prevent the child's separation from the family.

By applying FIR,<sup>59</sup> the risk situations that children/families with children are in have been identified in relation to:

- the economic situation of the family;
- the social situation of the family;
- health status of family members;
- education level of family members;
- living conditions of the family (including environmental factors);
- the existence of risk behaviors identified in the family.

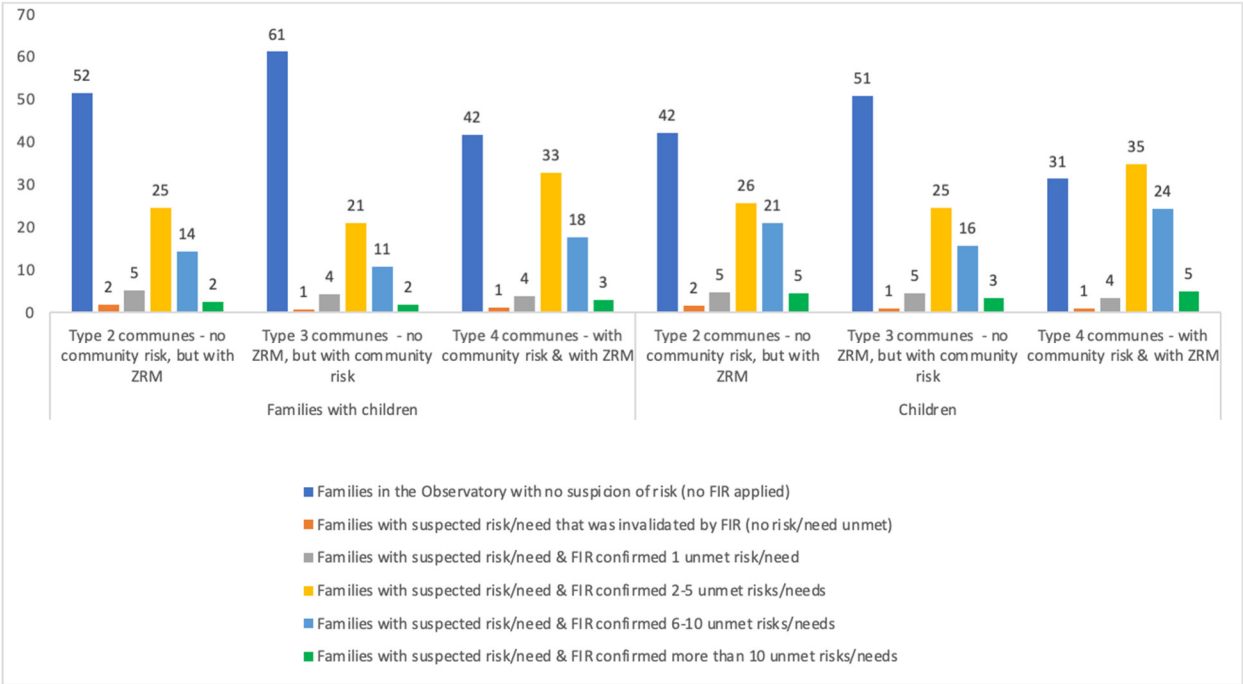

In the Observatories of the 72 analyzed communes there are 19,165 families registered with a total of 34,831 children.<sup>60</sup> Of these, over 51 percent (or 9,681) families had at least one risk suspicion reported by a local specialist.<sup>61</sup> Therefore, the SPAS applied FIR to these families in order to identify the children in risk situations that require the provision of services and social benefits.

Table 1 shows that the share of families assessed via FIR significantly varies by type of vulnerable community, from about 39 percent of families from type 3 communes (without ZRM and with a high IRC), to 48 percent of those in type 2 communes (with ZRM and without IRC), to over 58 percent respectively in the most exposed communes, type 4, which also have community risk and at least one marginalized area.

The analysis of risk situations and of uncovered needs confirms that the three types of communes identified according to the methodology from section 2.1 are indeed vulnerable communities. Figure 4 shows that, less than half of the population of children from the 72 communities have a virtually zero risk of separation.<sup>62</sup> The share of children with a virtually zero risk varies between 52 percent of children from type 3 communes and 32 percent children from type 4 communes (with a high IRC and ZRM). Most children from these types of communes cumulate between 2 and 10 risks/uncovered needs. The situation of children, when it comes to the risk of being separated from their families, is somewhat better in type 3 communes (without ZRM), compared to type 2 and 4 (with ZRM). Either way, in all types of communes, there is a 3-5 percent share of children who require special attention, as they have a high risk of being separated from their families (they cumulate more than 10 risks/uncovered needs).<sup>63</sup> These children belong to the 2-3 percent of families with children, from all 72 communes.

The most frequent risks and uncovered needs refer to:

- Economic risks: Among families with children from the sample, between about 40 percent and 50 percent (from type 4 communes) are exposed to the risk of monetary or extreme poverty or of infrequent labor.<sup>64</sup>
- Families in poverty (monetary or extreme) who do not receive social benefits addressed to poverty (VMG, heating aid, emergency aid, social cafeteria, EU food aid) are more numerous in type 2 communes, that have large Roma communities. Their share in the total of families with children is 7 percent in type 2 communes compared to 3 percent in type 3 communes (with IRC, without ZRM).
- Social risks regarding incomplete families affect 21 percent of the total of families from the 72 vulnerable communities. Incomplete families are for the most part single mothers with children, the father is usually either divorced/separated and has moved, or he left to work abroad.
- Disabilities are present in 6 percent of the families with children. In 3 percent of families with children there is a child with disabilities, and in the other 3 percent of families, the children live with a mother, a father, grandmother, or other adult with disabilities.
- Risk situations regarding the health of family members that affect large enough percentages of families with children to require the development of specific services are: (i) being registered with a family physician, typical risk situation for type 2 communities (with ZRM, that include large Roma communities); (ii) Limited access to necessary medical treatments, equipment, or services, typical risk situation for type 4 communities (with ethnically mixed ZRM and with community risk); (iii) Limited access to sanitary facilities (infrastructure), a widespread need not only in the selected communes, but across the whole rural area.
- Risk situations regarding the level of education of children affects large enough shares of the population of families with children and the population of children from the 72 community Observatories analyzed. The most widespread problems relate to the limited access to education facilities and the difficulties of families to support three or more children to attend kindergarten or school. However, situations of families with one or more school-aged children (3-17 years old) who do not attend the courses of a form of compulsory education are also frequent, as well as families where one or more children with ages between 6 and 17 years old go to school, but are at risk of dropping out.<sup>65</sup>
- Irrespective of the type of commune, children's participation significantly rises from daycare to kindergarten, is at the best level during primary school, decreases during secondary school, and decreases sharply for 15+ years old young people (

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their resilience resources, in such a way that the situation becomes so fragile that an unexpected unfortunate event (sometimes a minor one) can lead to a crisis, an inevitable turning point, in which the only conceivable solution is the temporary separation of the child from the family, in the best interest of the child. There are also cases when the separation happens suddenly, without any preparation, for example, as a result of an accident in which the parents die, or the family loses their house in a fire. However, the gradual process is the dominant one. (Stănculescu et al. (coord.), 2016)

- Figure 5). Young people's participation in education is somewhat better in type 3 communities (with community risk and without ZRM) compared to that in ZRM communities (types 2 and 4).

- Approximately 34 percent of families with children registered in the 72 analyzed community Observatories have limited access to education facilities. 43 percent of all the children from these communes live in these families. The share of deprived families is significantly larger in type 4 and 2 communes (with ZRM), as opposed to type 3 communes. The education facilities that are not present in a large part of the households include: a special place for children in the household, books/toys/games, Internet connection and the necessary equipment (computer/tablet/phone) available for all children to connect to online school/kindergarten. One can observe that deprivation is significantly larger among families with children exposed to the risk of monetary poverty (and, implicitly, extreme poverty).
- When it comes to housing, the insufficient space in the dwelling (overcrowding) and dwellings that are not connected to the sewage system are the most widespread problems. Housing insecurity is a risk that can be found especially in type 2 communes, with ZRM that include Roma communities. About 2 percent of families with children in the type 2 communes Observatory live either in dwellings occupied without legal rights, or in makeshift shelters, such as sheds, water houses, dilapidated buildings, caves, shacks, etc.

### 3. Map of investment priorities in day care centers

This chapter uses the results of the previous chapters in order to identify the investment priorities in day care centers that meet the needs of vulnerable communities with regard to the prevention of child's separation from the family. For this purpose, the map of available services and infrastructure (from chapter 1) is intersected with the typology of vulnerable communities (from chapter 2). By doing so, we can identify the communities (vulnerable/marginalized) with the greatest needs and fewest resources (services and infrastructure) which represent the investment priorities for building the network of day care centers with a maximum potential impact of preventing the separation of the child from the family.

Table 2 shows that in Romania, localities can be grouped in the following categories:

- 1) **High priority** of investing in day care centers<sup>66</sup> - 177 vulnerable communes (type 2, 3 or 4 communes) and 12 cities, that belong to the white zones of services. At national level, these are 6 percent of the total ATUs in Romania.
- 2) **Medium priority** of investing in day care centers<sup>67</sup> - 378 vulnerable communes (type 2, 3 or 4 communes) and 34 cities, that belong to the localities with one type of specialist. In total, they constitute 13 percent of all the localities in Romania.
- 3) **Low priority** of investing in day care centers<sup>68</sup> - 542 vulnerable communes (type 2, 3 or 4 communes), 105 cities and 19 municipalities, that belong to the localities with two or more type of specialists. In total, they represent 21 percent of all ATUs in Romania.

Without investment needs in day care centers for children and families with children - communes without community risk and without a marginalized area (type 1), as well as vulnerable communes, towns, cities and Bucharest sectors that have day care centers and specialists for the prevention of the separation of the child from the family.

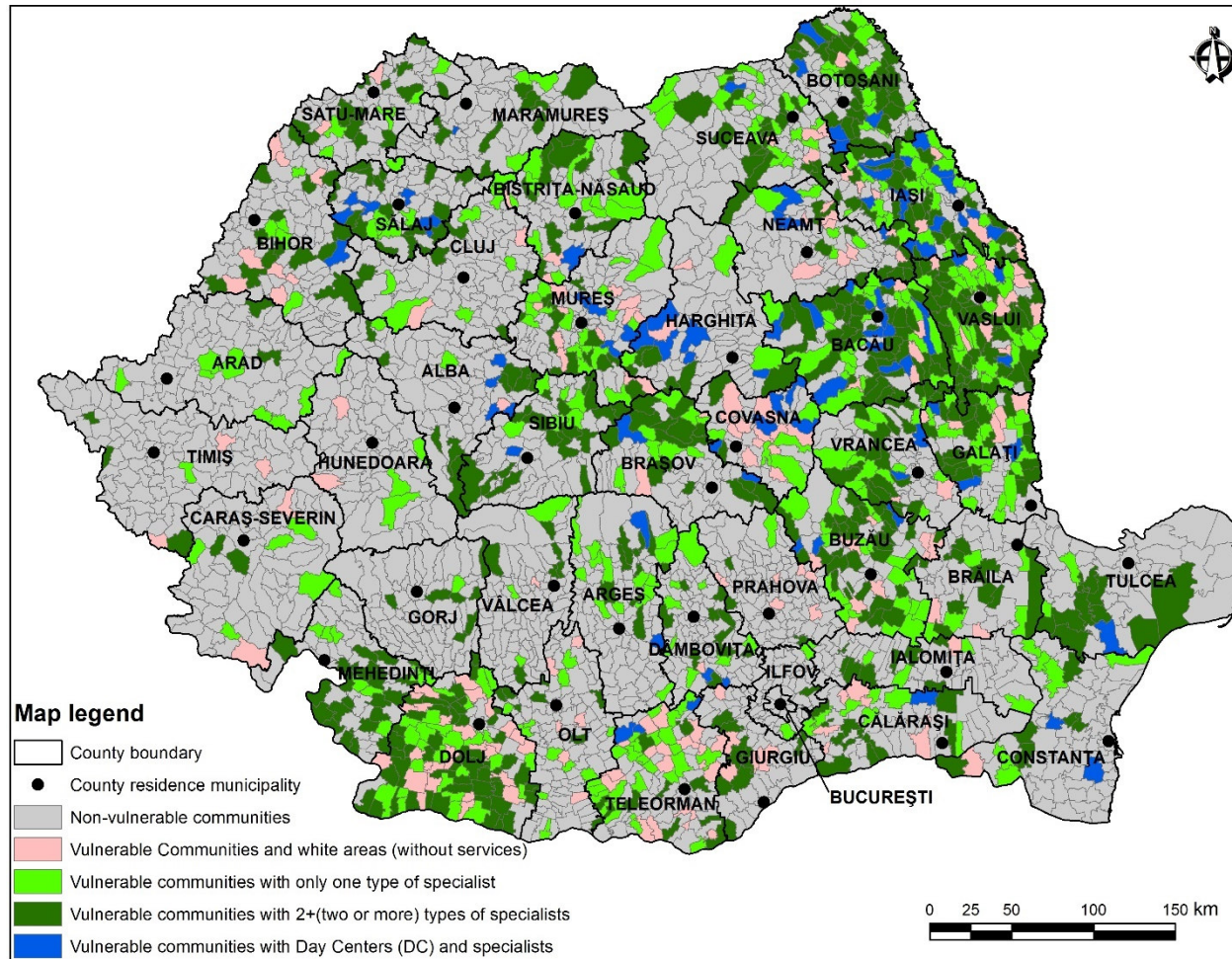
